

Opera Project and Tobacco Factory Theatres return to Mozart and, for many, the greatest opera ever written.

Within minutes of the opera opening, Don Giovanni is involved in a duel with the Commendatore, whose daughter Anna he has abducted. The Commendatore is killed and the tone is set for a series of brutal escapades, culminating in a graveyard where Giovanni invites the statue of the Commendatore to dinner. Unbelievably for the Don, the statue accepts and the opera reaches its climax in the famous supper scene during which Giovanni is dragged to hell.

This is the story of a man entirely driven by desire for sexual conquest, a desire that not only controls his own life but those around him. This tale of seduction, murder and divine retribution is nevertheless richly imbued with darkly comic episodes, provided by the fast and furious interplay between Giovanni and his servant Leporello, one of opera's most memorable creations.

Opera Project have assembled a spectacular line-up for this one, with the brilliant George von Bergen in the title role, leading a cast almost entirely new to Tobacco Factory Theatres. Jonathan Lyness conducts another of his superb orchestral arrangements and Richard Studer brings an unexpected twist to the story.

JEWENING MMIGRANT

Written and Performed by Inua Ellams

By turns funny and heartbreaking, we are thrilled to present this autobiographical piece of storytelling by award-winning poet and playwright Inua Ellams.

Born to a Muslim father and a Christian mother in what is now considered to be Boko Haram territory, in 1996 at the age of 12, Inua Ellams left Nigeria for England. He then moved to Ireland briefly before returning to London and starting work as a writer and graphic designer.

Part of his fascinating story was documented in his hilarious, Edinburgh Fringe First Award-winning play The 14th Tale, but much of it is untold. Littered with poems, stories and anecdotes, over the course of an evening, Inua tells his ridiculous, fantastic, poignant immigrant-story of escaping extremist Islam, directing an arts festival at his college in Dublin, performing solo shows at the National Theatre, and drinking wine with the Queen of England, all the while without a country to belong to or place to call home.

Born in Nigeria, Inua Ellams is an award-winning poet, playwright and founder of the Midnight Run - an international, arts-filled, nighttime urban walking experience. Identity, displacement and destiny are recurring themes in his work, in which he tries mixing the old

Samuel Bailey grew up in the Midlands and moved to Bristol in 2010 when he began writing. Most recently he has been part of The Old Vic 12, for whom he wrote Prince of the River. Director Jesse Jones (1972: The Future of Sex, A Day to Remember, The Grandfathers) is a theatre maker from Bristol and co-founder of The Wardrobe Ensemble and The Wardrobe Theatre. Jesse trained on Bristol Old Vic's Made in Bristol programme, The National Theatre Studio directors programme and was awarded the Regional Theatre Young Director Scheme bursary.



CYP HIGHLIGHTS

Our Children and Young People programme has grown rapidly over the past 15 months so we wanted to take a moment to reflect on all that has happened and look forward to what is still to come!

THE DAHL PROJECT



Timed to coincide with the centenary of Roald Dahl's birth in 2016, The Dahl Project is a collaborative project for children and young people between Tobacco Factory Theatres and Travelling Light Theatre Company. It is a multiphase project engaging young people, the majority from disadvantaged backgrounds, with drama, literature and theatre.

Phase One of this project aimed to bolster literacy skills in school workshops. Year 3 pupils from Merchants' Academy and Barton Hill Primary were inspired by Roald Dahl's characters to create their own. The thirty finished characters are presented in a book, born straight from the imaginations, paintbrushes and words of the young participants. The Marvellous Book of Imagination has been distributed to all those involved. local libraries and The Dahl Museum.

Phase Two is a summer school for twenty 13-19 year olds, who will use the phizz-popping characters from The Marvellous Book of Imagination as the basis for a brand new, devised piece of theatre. Working with a professional director, writer and designer, the young people will

spend two weeks in the rehearsal room playing, improvising and creating a new show to be performed at The Wardrobe Theatre. The project also offers opportunities for four Young Artists aged 19-25 years (a director, writer, designer and production assistant) to be mentored by professionals and develop their experience of working with young people.

Phase Three takes place in the autumn when the Young Artists will take the helm and work with a scaled-down script for three performers, also aged 19-25. Working within a seven-day research and development period, supported by both theatre companies and the professionals from Phase Two, this young company will rehearse and prepare the piece for an exclusive sharing to an invited audience.

IntoUniversity offers an innovative programme that supports young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to attain either a university place or another chosen aspiration. We have worked with Bristol East and Bristol South centres, delivering theatre tours and workshops for Merchants' Academy, Hannah More Primary and St Pius X Primary School.

YOUNG THEATRE MAKERS

Since April 2015, we have launched two youth theatres for 11-13 and 14-19 year olds. Our Young Theatre Makers initiative provides young people with the rare chance to work with professional artists and to engage with live theatre both on and off stage. We also encourage the companies to follow their own interests within theatre from writing and acting, to theatre design and costume making. We are proud to provide bursaries and support with transport costs to ensure that the activity is truly inclusive.

Our focus on allowing the young people to be self-governing and create and develop their own performance sets it apart; a performance is created every 10 weeks meaning that the young people regularly see the fruits of their labour presented on stage at a professional venue. Most recently, both our YTM companies performed on the same night in our Factory Theatre. Double Down was an evening of devised theatre that came completely from the young people (with shaping from our professional directors); it was truly wonderful to see so many young people performing in a professional environment and absolutely rising to the occasion!

LAST YEAR

We welcomed a phenomenal 140,782 people through our doors to 628 performances, classes, talks, workshops and other events. 1024 people took part in participatory activities, including 890 children and young people. Our co-production of Dracula won 3 Critics' Circle National Dance Awards including outstanding male performance and the Dancing Times Award for Best Male Dancer. We created 6 new productions and toured 8 productions nationally, engaging 22,866 people with Tobacco Factory Theatres on the road.

MAKING WORK

IN-HOUSE PRODUCTIONS

We are investing ambitiously in more of our own productions and co-productions with key partners.

Our vision is to bring world class directors, actors, and musicians to Tobacco Factory Theatres, as well as to invest in developing the best new talent from Bristol and across the country.

The Factory Theatre has tiered seating with only a certain amount of seats on floor level. Tobacco Factory Theatres has a lift and an accessible toilet on the same floor as the theatre.


